The CAPS Writing Drop-In Lab: A Place to Write

Individual, 1-on-1 writing tutoring, in which students bring in a draft and receive feedback, remains an important service that is offered at CAPS. Increasingly, students are being guided toward a Drop-In format. The Writing Drop-In Lab is a space in which students can work on their writing, either independently or in groups of peers, with the goal to provide support for students while they are actively engaged in the writing process. Instead of struggling in isolation over how to begin a piece of writing, what a prompt means, or how to word a particular idea, students can do their writing in the Drop-In lab. Here, the tutors are available to help with such issues as they arise. Tutors in the Drop-In Lab can also provide support for collaboration on group projects, and peer review.
