

PCA Recap 4/7/26

Announcements:

- Reminders for Math: If a student passes the support course (UNIV 102 or FYEX 1020) but does not pass the paired math course (MATH 1215 or MATH 1130), the student must take both classes in the pairing if/when they retake it. The support course is repeatable for credit. Advisors are not authorized to provide corequisite overrides for the Math/support course pairings.
- NSO: OAS will be providing major change support during Transfer A next week. Advisement centers should assure future appointments are available appointments so that OAS can help the student schedule a meeting with their new advisor.
- Joe and Stephanie will be reaching out to interested colleges regarding a cost-share model for those who are wanting to participate in texting through SignalVine/Modern Campus Message

Stephanie Hands, Robert Vanderburg and Glenda Johnson provided a demonstration of a new LoboTrax form/workflow for GenEd/CAC exceptions and stripping credit. Glenda will develop training to provide to advisors for the new process as it rolls out. OAS will provide updated guidance on CAC substitution as the leadership of the committee has adjusted their criteria. This form does not represent an overall change in process; it just moves the process from emails and PDFs to a workflow. Adding the process to strip duplicate credit for AP/IB/transfer work is just creating a more formal documentation and tracking process instead of email/SharePoint ticket.

Clarification to updated transfer course articulation processes were provided. For international courses, students will submit a form to the LoboTrax team who will provide the student (and GEO) with the number of hours that would transfer and any information about previously articulated course equivalencies. Students who are told their courses will come back as generic credit but want to have specifically articulated courses prior to leaving for their experience can work with departments to have courses evaluated – departments can email the equivalency information to tes1@unm.edu to have it documented.

The only change to domestic course evaluations was that the PDF form was removed from the Registrar's forms website and courses can no longer be evaluated for equivalency "for this student only." The course is either equivalent or not. If a department wants a class to count toward a requirement for one student only, it should be an exception.
