Thesis/Capstone Project

- The Honors Thesis/Capstone is a comprehensive 6-credit research effort of original scholarship.
- It is most often completed over two semesters (3 + 3 credits) in the senior year.
- Students work closely with faculty on advanced research topics or creative endeavors.

- National Honors Societies



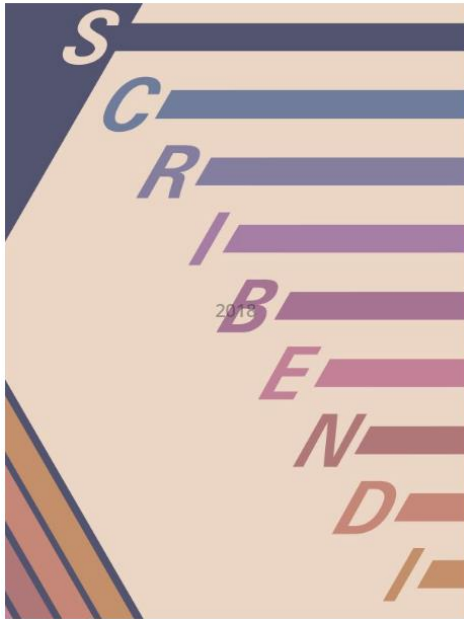
