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
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Who I Am

A Little Context

ME Program:

- 793 registered undergrads
- 137 registered grads
- 500+ active unregistered
- UG program is a PreMajor to Major model
- Diverse student population including First Gen, military, non-traditional, low socio-economic backgrounds, broad range of ethnicities, already in workforce
- Holds requiring advisement every semester.





A Little Context

New Student Orientation:

- 11 sessions
- 227 students (just for ME)
- Average SAT: 1110, Math: 550, English: 560
- Math placement: 152 at Trig/PreCalc or below (53 of those at Foundational Math = below Intermediate Algebra)
- 67% of our First Year students are on a 5-year pathway



How GS Leadership and Advising Intersect

Transferable Skills: Girl Scout Leader → Academic Advisor

- Mentorship & Guidance Foster growth, confidence, and self-direction through individualized support.
- Goal Setting & Achievement Help others identify goals, plan actionable steps, and reflect on outcomes.
- Relationship Building Build trust and rapport to create safe, inclusive, and supportive environments.
- Skill Development Coach communication, teamwork, problem-solving, and leadership skills.
- Adaptability & Flexibility Balance structured programs with personalized approaches to meet diverse needs.
- Advocacy & Empowerment Champion the needs and voices of individuals within larger systems.
- Organization & Planning Coordinate schedules, activities, and resources for complex groups.
- Conflict Resolution Mediate disagreements and foster collaboration among peers or group members.
- Communication Model clear, empathetic, and effective communication across age and experience levels.
- Leadership through Service Inspire others to engage in community impact and continuous learning.



Let the Games Begin

- It began as a game I do with my Girl Scouts
- 19 Girls, 6 weeks, 2 x a 27 foot U-Haul, and over 20,000 boxes of cookies











Let the Games Begin - NSO

- 10 boxes of different colors with a letter inside
- Each box has a question correlating to being a ME PreMajor
- Each box contains a letter they earn by answering the question
- Once all questions are answered figure out the phrase







How Did This Change Things?

- Registration on second day went smoother
- Less students with unreported scores/AP/IB/Dual Credit
- Students took a more active role locating information
- More camaraderie
- Getting ready for spring registration impacts:
 - Students have made better course choices
 - Students understanding resources
 - Students understanding their responsibilities
 - Students utilizing their resources (every time they mention their Math Track I want to cry for joy)



Upcoming: Badges to Bachelors

- Students will be given tasks to accomplish to:
 - Enhance engagement
 - Develop essential skills
 - Promote academic confidence
- Examples of categories included:
 - Audit Reader learning to use LoboTrax
 - Graduation Planner developing a "4-year" plan
 - Campus Connector joining student organizations and attending events

 Accomplishing a category earns the student a pin (badge) and we will highlight their accomplishments at the next fall welcome event (kind of like we do at a Girl Scout award/bridging ceremony)



What Is Your Hidden Resource?

- What do you do when you aren't advising?
- Hobbies? Coaching?
- How do these things relate to what you do? Do they?
- OF COURSE THEY DO!

- I'm a gamer. We have a Brain Break Table now. I use video game concepts in our ME Department Orientation.
- I'm an artist. We have community building projects like decorating pumpkins and making Valentines.
